



## Information for Contributors

### Aims and scope

The peer-reviewed electronic journal “Tribology Online” is dedicated to facilitating global exchange of up-to-date information among tribologists and researchers in relevant fields through rapid publication of high-quality papers on all aspects of tribology: science and technology of lubrication, friction, wear, lubricants, tribo-materials, tribo-systems, and so on. The journal is open access and fully supported by the Japanese Society of Tribologists; authors can publish with no publication fee, and readers can access the publication with no subscription fee.

### Types of contribution

Tribology Online publishes *Article*, *Short Communication* and *Review*.

*Article* is intended to be an original report of researches and technological developments in tribology and relevant fields.

*Short Communication* is intended to be a preliminary report of new concepts, findings, technological developments and opinions whose rapid publication will be important for a large number of readers in relevant fields.

*Review* is intended to be a review of researches and technological developments in tribology and relevant fields.

### Length of manuscripts

Recommended length for *Short Communications* is **four printed pages** (e.g. 2,000 words plus less than ten figures/tables).

There is **no page limit** for *Articles* and *Reviews*.

### Ethics and responsibilities of authors

It is essential that all who participate in producing the journal conduct themselves as authors, reviewers, editors, and publishers in accord with the highest level of professional ethics and standards. By submitting a manuscript to this journal, each author implicitly confirms that it meets the highest ethical standards. Also, authors should be responsible for statements or opinions advanced in papers to be published in this journal.

### Originality

Submission of manuscripts implies that it has not been published previously and is not currently under consideration for publication elsewhere.

### Plagiarism and falsified data

Submitted manuscripts must not contain plagiarized material or falsified research data. Proper acknowledgement must be given when using data, text, or theories by others.

### Authorship

Authorship of submitted manuscripts should be limited to individuals who have made a significant contribution to the study and manuscript preparation.

### Measures in case of infraction

If an author is determined not to comply with the above rules, corrective measures will be implemented, which include but not limited to the following:

- If the manuscript is under review, it may be rejected.
- If the paper has already been published, depending on the severity of the infraction, either of the following may occur:
  - Addition of an erratum/correction to the paper
  - Publication of an expression of concern on the paper
  - Retraction of the paper

### Preparation of manuscripts

Manuscripts must be written in English and prepared in accordance with Authors' Guide for Manuscript Preparation, which describes structure of manuscripts, necessary elements to be included and their formats. Manuscripts should be prepared in electronic form using accepted word-processing software.

### Submission of manuscripts

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### Peer review

Submitted manuscripts are peer reviewed by at least two reviewers. Reviewers make one of the following recommendations:



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- accept with no change required
- accept with minor revisions
- re-review after major revisions
- reject for publication

Decisions regarding acceptance of manuscripts are made by the Editor based on reviewers' recommendation. Mandatory and/or optional revisions, and minor amendments, if any, are listed and sent to the authors, who are responsible for making required changes or improvements in the manuscript and responses or rebuttals to reviewers' comments.

Evaluation of manuscripts of *Articles* is based upon novelty, technical quality, significance of research, clarity and conciseness in presentation, and definitiveness. English language quality is also considered in the evaluation.

Evaluation of manuscripts of *Short Communications* is based upon originality and technical quality. Significance of research, clarity in presentation and English language quality are also considered in the evaluation.

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When revisions are required, authors should submit a revised manuscript within a month after receipt of the list of comments and suggestions of reviewers, otherwise the manuscript will be treated as a new submission.

Views and opinions expressed in published papers are, even if changed or improved in the course of required revisions, those of the authors and not of the society.

## English language editing

Manuscripts with poor language quality will not be published. The Editor will ask the authors to have them edited by a native English speaker or a language editing service before they submit the final version.
